## Meet the iPad!

### Magic & Revolutionary

In May we welcomed Joe Kukella of Macintosh Systems Solutions in Key West. Joe hosted our very first look at the “magical and revolutionary” iPad from Apple. The following article summarizes what so special about the newest innovation in the Apple line.

One of the first things you notice about iPad is how thin and light it is. The screen is 9.7 inches measured diagonally — slightly smaller than a magazine. It's just 1.5 pounds and 0.5 inch thick! And a slight curve to the back makes it easy to pick up and comfortable to hold.

#### LED-Backlit IPS Display

The high-resolution, LED-backlit display is remarkably crisp and vivid, no matter what angle you are viewing from. It's not great in full sunlight, but sit in the shade and do your web browsing, reading, movie watching, email, or photo viewing. With iPad, there is no up or down. It's designed to show off your content in portrait or landscape orientation when you turn it. You'll get a brilliant picture, with excellent color and contrast.

#### Multi-Touch

The Multi-Touch screen on iPad is based on the same technology as the iPhone, but reengineered for the larger iPad surface, making it precise and responsive. So whether you're zooming in on a map, flicking through your photos, or deleting an email, iPad responds with incredible accuracy.

#### Up to 10 Hour Battery Life

To maximize battery life, Apple used the same lithium-polymer battery technology developed for Mac notebook computers and applied it to the iPad. You can use iPad for up to 10 hours while surfing the web on Wi-Fi, watching videos, or listening to music. Surfing the web on a 3G data network, you can get up to 9 hours of battery life. (Battery life varies with how hard the iPad is actually working. Just listening

#### Wireless or 3G Communication

iPad takes advantage of the fastest Wi-Fi networks with built-in 802.11n technology. It automatically locates available Wi-Fi networks, which you join with a few taps. iPad also comes with Bluetooth 2.1 + EDR, letting you connect to devices like wireless headphones or the Apple Wireless Keyboard.

iPad just became available in a 3G model with superfast data speeds up to 7.2 Mbps. So if you're traveling or you happen to be somewhere without a Wi-Fi network, you can still get a fast connection.

### Performance/Under the Hood

The Apple A4 chip inside iPad was designed by Apple engineers to be extremely powerful yet extremely power efficient. The performance is unlike anything you've ever seen on a touch-based device. This makes iPad fantastic for everything from productivity apps to games.

### Connectivity

The dock connector port (30-pin, like the iPhone and Touch) on the bottom of iPad allows you to dock and charge it. It also lets you connect to accessories like the iPad Camera Connection Kit and the iPad Keyboard Dock. You'll find many accessories designed to be compatible with the iPad.

### Audio

The powerful built-in speaker produces rich, full sound perfect for watching a movie or listening to music. iPad also comes with a headphone jack and a built-in microphone. With 3G connectivity it can even be used as a giant iPhone!



### Accessories

What makes iPad even better? Accessories. The iPad Keyboard Dock combines a dock with a full-size keyboard. You can import photos from a digital camera or SD card with the iPad Camera Connection Kit. The iPad Case not only protects your iPad, it lets you use it in various positions. And differ-

ent adapters let you connect iPad to TVs, projectors, and displays.

### Apps for Your iPad

Over 150,000 apps are ready and waiting for you! If you already have apps for your iPhone or iPod touch, just sync them to iPad from your Mac or PC. They run in their original size or you can expand them to fill the iPad screen. And you can choose from over 150,000 iPhone and iPod touch apps in the App Store. iPad works with almost all of them.

Tap the App Store icon to download apps wherever you are. Browse a section of the store that features apps designed specifically for iPad. Tap the Genius icon to get recommendations for apps that you might like based on apps you and others have downloaded.

### More to Come

The iPads we saw are just the beginning of what Apple has planned for us. While amazing just as it is, the iPad will get more capabilities and become even better as the product line unfolds. **MU**

## Stickies in Mac OS X Snow Leopard

Stickies is a special type of application window that remains on your Desktop as long as the Stickies application is running. You can use them for anything that a real-world sticky note can handle.

A sticky can contain data pasted from the Clipboard, you can type into it, and include graphics and different fonts and colors. You can even locate specific text from somewhere in your vast collection of Stickies by using the Find command within the application. Follow these steps to stick your way to success:

1. Open your Applications folder and run the Stickies application. The text cursor is already idling in the new window.

2. Type text in the window or press Command+V to paste the contents of the Clipboard into the window.

You can also import the contents of an existing file into a Sticky. Just click File and then choose Import Text to display a standard Open dialog.

3. Optionally, add text formatting, change text font, and change font color from the Font menu. From the Note menu, you can also choose to make the Sticky translucent. (Because they just look cool!)

4. Optionally, click the Color menu and choose the appropriate hue for your Sticky.

5. Resize and drag the Sticky window to the desired location.

Press Command+M to toggle between a miniaturized view (showing only the title bar) and the expanded view.

To automatically run the Stickies application each time you log on, open the Accounts settings in System Preferences and click your account in the list. Click the Login Items button and add Stickies to the list by clicking the plus button.

To delete a Sticky, simply click the Close button at the upper-left corner of the Sticky window. Or click the Sticky to make it the active note and then click Close. Stickies display a dialog to confirm that you want to close the note; click Save to save the contents in a file or click the Don't Save button to close the note and discard its contents.

To close the Stickies application completely, click any note and press Command+Q. **MU**

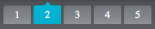
