Online Banking

We were pleased to welcome Nola Acker as our speaker in September. Nola brings a fun spin to anything she talks about, but we could also appreciate the depth of her experience and knowledge — a great combination for a very info-taining evening!

Nola showed us all the functions available in First State's online banking site, then went on to talk about mobile banking, using debit and credit cards, fraud exposure, merchant services, and a host of other banking issues. I hope I can do this one justice in the recap!

First State's Site

When you sign up for an account, you get an ID and password to let you in to the site, which is http://keysbank.com. If you have multiple accounts, they are linked, so you only have one ID to access everything (unless you have a commercial account that's not a sole proprietorship).

So once you pass by the welcome screen, which has all kinds of fun community info

on it, you get into your main account screen. It shows you each account (you can assign them nicknames so you don't have to refer to them by account number). You can see at a glance the available and current balance for each, and totals. At the

right you see an orange circle with an arrow. Click and hold on this to pop up a menu of available options: View History; Account

What You Can Do with Pages'09

Build attractive pages that look professional — for peanuts! Pages'09 even runs on your iPad. It's a powerhouse of a program, come see what it can do.



Beginners: Come at 6:30 and bring your Mac and your questions. There will be some experienced users there to help for the half-hour before the formal presentation starts! Experienced users: please come and help!

Details; Pending Items; Transfer From; Transfer To; and Print.

Account Details

This is the option you'll probably use the most, and it seems to hold a lot of information.

The first thing you see are items pending. Nola explained the concept of items pending vs. items posted; this is the difference you see between available balance and current balance; some items have not

gone through, so the funds are not in your account yet.

"Check 21"

Nola explained that with the "Check 21" act, no paper actually leaves the bank where it is deposited. Used to be, banks routed paper all over the country to other banks for processing. Now it's all electronic. Once the image is captured and processed electronically, the paper is stored for 6 months before it is destroyed. The electronic image is used as though it were the original. You can see check images and deposit slip images

online, and print them if you need to.

Posting of Debits and Checks

Checks are posted to your account at midnight, as are ACH credits. But twice a day, transactions come in and are visible on your account, shown as pending. (8:30-ish in the morning and at 4:30-ish in the evening.) Debits (when you use your debit card) pop in real time. These postings change your available balance when they come in. You'll sometimes see holds for strange amounts, like \$75 at a gas station, when you know you didn't spend that exact amount. It's a temporary hold and will straighten itself out overnight.

More, under Accounts

So, on the left you see an Online Activity tab, which Nola says she doesn't find very useful, although if you're curious as to whether someone is doing something with your account (unauthorized), this is a fast way to see what activity has happened recently.

You can view your statements online. If you find you are missing a printed statement come tax time, you can reprint it using this tab.

Transactions Tab

Under this tab you can transfer funds from one account to another (as long as they're linked). You can do this on a onetime basis, or set up recurring transfers.

Any transfer between FSB accounts that you make before 8pm goes through that day. This is great for covering your balance if you're running close. You can check and see what's going to post and transfer enough to cover it, avoiding overdraft fees.

Online Bill Paying

You can set up for bills to be paid automatically, on a recurring basis, or one time only. If you know the recipient's account number, an ACH payment is possible (the site helps you search for and find a company's info, based on phone number and address). If there isn't an account available, a check will be printed and mailed. (If it's to be mailed, you need to allow extra time for that to happen or your payment could be late.)

Functions you can do on this screen:

- Auto Pav
- Set up Reminders
- Update Billing Info
- Delete this Biller

Under "Bill Pay" you can change your profile information; things like username and password, what email account is used; etc.

The Services Tab

Under this tab you can change preferences about Messages, change your user information, and enroll in Bill Pay.

Alerts, are pretty cool! You can set it up to be notified if your available balance is less than a certain amount, or if the account is accessed (perhaps by your child). You choose whether you prefer to be emailed, texted or called on the phone.

You can be alerted if a debit of greater than X amount comes through, or if someone changes your account information, or if there's a funds transfer - etc. It really gives you close control of your account.

Other things you can do under the Services tab: Change your address (although continued on page three

it's just for online purposes - you will need to show up at the bank to prove it's you and change your address for statements and such).

You can stop payment on an item, or even order printed checks under this tab.

The Preferences Tab

Account: Lets you set up those nicknames for your accounts that we mentioned earlier, and other account preferences.

Alerts: Set up alerts and reminders to notify you of important account information and personal reminders based on your selected preferences.

Security: To change your password.

User: Allows you to change address and other information about yourself (only for online use).

Mobile: This is where you sent up for banking on your mobile device(s).

Statement Delivery: Select your statement delivery preference for each of your online-enabled accounts.

You can check your balance, look at history, see transactions and check your running balance - a lot like the overview screen we just looked at on the computer.

You can transfer funds between your accounts. With some mobile apps you can also pay bills from your device.

Other online transactions

You can do cash management (ACH transactions and wire transfers) from your mobile device. There are fees associated with these transactions. There are several levels of security - passwords and PINs - to keep this safe.

Security

Nola talked about the exposure of using a debit vs. credit card. Think of pumping gas. All one has to guess to use your credit card is your billing zip code - not that hard. With a debit card, they have to guess your PIN, which is harder, meaning it's more secure.

Be award that there are devices that thieves can put into ATM machines and card readers that capture the info from the cards entered. Nola says you can actually see these if you look into the slot! The bank checks their ATMs several times a day to make sure they are free of these devices.

The banking industry has stringent controls on how those who take debit and credit cards must be responsible protect your data. They have to keep their systems up to date and restrict access to those who need to know. The up-to-date software has high-level encryption built in.

For example, last year, there was a rash of credit card fraud in Key Largo. This was traced to one local restaurant using an unencrypted, old piece of software for their credit card processing. Someone was able to pull the information being sent in, made new cards with it, and sold them on the street in Miami. This is exactly why the requirements need to be so stringent.

Mobile Credit Card Processing

Maybe you are a vendor who sells wares from a booth at fairs and events. There are Apps for taking credit cards now. They come with a little reader that plugs into the earphone jack of your phone to read the customer's card.

Be very careful before deciding which of these to use. Some are not PCI-compliant, meaning, they aren't secure. Thieves near event grounds can skim numbers from unsecured transactions.

Nola said she knows there are problems with the one called "Square." There's another called "Pay Anywhere," and she wasn't sure whether that one was truly secure. She said the cradle-type ones are better in general, but do your homework!

Tips to protect against fraud

Create a long and strong password! Change it every 3-6 months.

Watch for fake emails from financial institutions. Your bank (and the IRS, etc.) will never email you and ask for information. These are scammers, phishing for info!

Never auto-save your password. Always type it in, and make sure you're on a secure network when you do.

Be vigilant about viruses and spyware.

Don't preprint your checks with personal info like your Social Security or Driver's License number.

Review your credit report periodically and make sure you understand all the transactions done in your name. Close old accounts you aren't using.

Protect/destroy any documents with sensitive info printed on it. MU

Prezi Viewer for iPad

If boring slide decks are not your thing, then consider creating presentations with Prezi Viewer. The free iPad app presents dynamic presentations that are more like movies than a series of slides, as they're filled with movement and media. Once the presentation has been created on the Prezi Website, it is synced with the app for flawless presentations. The viewer app marries the fluidity of the iPad's multitouch gestures, providing a quicker and more interactive interface than traditional slideshows.

Next Slide >

Boring, static slide shows could become a thing of the past. Prezi is a free online service that can be used to easily create beautiful, dynamic presentations that are more like movies than a series of slides; they're filled with movement and media.

Prezi Viewer marries the fluidity of the iPad's dynamics with its multi-touch gestures, allowing for a quicker and more interactive interface rather than the conventional method of being restricted to one slide after another. For the optimal presentation experience, those using the iPad 2 or new iPad have the ability to connect to a projector with a VGA cable.

With a recent update, the Prezi Viewer app has enabled editing, so users can quickly fix a typo on the go; however, the ability to create new projects is not yet available. One other downside is that users cannot incorporate PDFs, YouTube or Flash videos, since Flash is not compatible with iOS devices.

Once you start using Prezi Viewer, people will no longer dread your presentations; they will look forward to them.

Quick Tip: Monitor Your System From the Dock
